We apologise for the delay in creating the Tutpup passwords etc. we have been in contact with the internet site and they have sent us the following message:

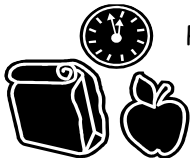

POW Funding!

I'm writing to you to let you know of a new project we're becoming involved in. The project is called **POW** (Positive Opportunities Worcestershire) and has been designed by central government to help children try new things that will help them do better at school and in life.

We have been awarded £1,140 for this project this academic year and will receive a similar amount in 2010 to use up until July 2011.

POW funding should be used to help children and young people who claim free school meals to take part in activities that they otherwise haven't been able to afford, for example football club on Wednesday or music lessons. These activities can be offered at school or other places, like leisure centres or clubs. POW funding can also pay fees for clubs such as Scouts, Cubs, Beavers, Brownies and many other organisations, even to join a local football team or music group. The funding can also pay for a pass for activities.

I will be contacting all of those families that are eligible for POW funding separately to offer support and guidance on how best to use the funding.

If you think you may be eligible to claim free school meals please speak to the office in confidence. Only children who claim free school meals are eligible for this funding.
